5. The Riverview Carousel was built in 1908 for Riverview Park in Chicago and is on the Nation Register of Historic Places. Name four famous people who have ridden the carousel.

6. On carousel hill, what type of fence has been built?

7. Military bases are found in many parts of Georgia. Which ride is symbolic of the paratrooper training facilities at Fort Benning near Columbus?

8. Beginning at the end of the Civil War, the lumber industry in Georgia began to prosper. Which attraction in the park is reminiscent of this industry?
